Project: MILE MARKER 19 FIRE RESEEDING
What: Spread sagebrush and grass seed by hand.

Where: Boise River Wildlife Management Area, north of High Bridge on Hwy 21.

When: Weekdays, January 25th and 30th, possibly one additional date.

Logistics: Materials provided, please bring a frame backpack for hauling seed if you have one.

People: Five to fifteen each day.

Project: <u>NEST BOX MAINTENANCE</u>

What: Maintain wood duck nest boxes along the Boise, Snake and Payette Rivers.

Where: Whitewater Park, Montour, Payette River, Crane Falls and Ted Trueblood Wildlife

Management Area.

When: Weekdays in February. Montour event on Saturday, Feb. 2nd, 2019.

Logistics: Tools, gloves, materials, and transportation provided.

People: Two to eight each day.

Project: SPRING SEEDLING SURVIVAL MONITORING

What: Locate, GPS, tag, evaluate and record seedling survival.

Where: Habitat planting sites in southwest Idaho.
When: Two weekdays each week in May, 2019.

Logistics: Tools and equipment provided. Bring a day pack.

People: Four to five each day.



Project: FIRE RESTORATION for WILDLIFE HABITAT

What: Plant bitterbrush and sagebrush seedlings to restore native upland habitats that burned

during previous summer wildfires.

Where: Boise River Wildlife Management Area (Mile Marker 19 Fire, Keithly Fire near Weiser),

Owyhee Mountains (possibly), and potentially other sites in southwestern Idaho.

When: March 2nd, 9th, 16th, and 23rd,

Logistics: Tools, gloves, and transportation provided.

People: Fifty to one-hundred each day.

Project: SNAKE RIVER CLEAN-UP (2 sites)

What: Pick up trash to clean up the banks of the Snake River.Where: Swan Falls and Map Rock sites (Walters Ferry to Marsing)

Logistics: Trash bags, some transportation provided. Wear gloves!

Project: <u>CASCADE STRAND PROJECT: RIPARIAN HABITAT RESTORATION PROJECT</u>

What: Bank stabilization with native shrub and tree plantings, willow weavings and barbs in

partnership with Valley Soil and Water Conservation District and the Idaho Soil and Water

Conservation Commission

Where: Streambanks along the N.F. Payette River near Cascade

When: Occasional weekdays and Saturdays, late April to early June 2019.
